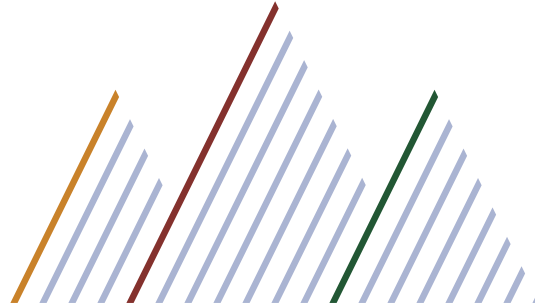

SUMMIT GOALS

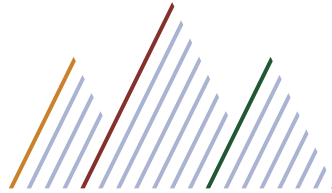
- To inspire and affect action in the main areas of activity to fight climate change:
